 - Cell Dogs., Inc. was a Guest Speaker at the General Monthly Meeting.

Cell Dogs, Inc. rehabilitate juveniles and adults in correctional institutions by teaching responsibility and imparting crucial life and job skills. In becoming contributing members of the community, the people who grow through our programs are far less likely to reoffend. The state of California typically spends upwards of \$90,000 each year to house and care for a single inmate. By heading off future incarcerations, our program saves taxpayer dollars.

Some special canine graduates become service dogs and help their human partners enjoy a fuller, more independent life. Their valuable skills benefit individuals with emotional, psychological and physical challenges and disabilities, changing the lives of entire families. Most recently, we have been training service dogs to support veterans and first responders with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

 Motion: The Executive Board moves to donate \$1,000 to Cell Dogs, Inc. for service dog training for the veterans and first responders. Motion was made, 2nd, and motion carried.

Wounded Warrior CKRmy: Proposed by Christine Beilby – Suggested donation \$500

This squad is participating in the Wounded Warrior Project carry forward 5k to provide life changing programs for American wounded warriors and they need support. When we rally together for injured veterans, we help ensure they get the help they need and deserve.

The Warrior Foundation Freedom Station was founded in 2004 and is celebrating their 20th anniversary. They have helped thousands of ill and injured military heroes. These heroes are learning to overcome their injuries through recovery, rehabilitation and transitioning back to civilian life. Their mission is to provide support services and assist them and their families during their recovery. They offer several support services for those suffering from post-traumatic stress (PDSD), traumatic brain injuries (TBI), seriously ill or injured, and physical or occupational therapy, personal support, mentorship programs, wellness programs transitional housing (an 18-month housing program), personal support just to name a few.

• **Motion:** The Board moves to donate \$500.00 to the Wounded Warrior Foundation Freedom Station to help support their mission in helping our ill and injured military heroes through recovery, rehabilitation, and transitioning back to a civilian. Motion was made, 2nd, and motion carried.

> The Warrior Foundation Freedom Station: Proposed by Phyllis Helt - Suggested donation \$1,000.00 (corrected)

This organization was founded in San Diego 2004. In October they will be celebrating their 20th Anniversary. They have helped thousands of ill and injured military heroes. These veterans are learning to overcome their injuries through recovery rehabilitation and transitioning back to life and reality. Their mission is to provide support services, temporary housing, during their recovery. They also offer services for those suffering from PTSD, traumatic brain injuries, serious illness, mentorship programs, as well as temporary housing for eighteen (18) months.

On October 6, 2024, the Orange County chapter is sponsoring "*Ride for the Warriors*" from Orange County to San Diego County to support the foundation and to donate funding for their temporary housing that they are building. This will include sponsoring two (2) riders, two (2) T-Shirts with our logo as well as on their event banner.
